- A. "Making Every Moment Count-Overview of Hudson Valley Hospice Services" presented by Sophia Sciacca; Provider Relations Representative at Hudson Valley Hospice.

Hudson Valley Hospice has served Dutchess and Ulster Counties for 35 years. Hospice services provides value to the recipient, family, and care givers. Hospice is much more than the last few weeks or days of life. HV Hospice provides palliative and hospice care to anyone of any age, even newborns that has any life limiting illness when no cure is possible (not just end-stage). Hospice care can be provided in any location: private homes, nursing home, assisted living, group homes, hospitals.

Hospice care services the whole family and can cover meds, equipment, oxygen, therapies, etc. Insurance, Medicaid, and hospice foundation can cover the costs of hospice care.

B. “COVID Testing in Ulster County” presented by Hillary Harvey; Ulster County Innovation Team

UC Recovery Service Center is an evolution of the UC COVID-19 Hotline. The service center addresses the various needs of the County as the pandemic progresses. The service center operates Monday 8am-7pm, Tuesday-Thursday 8am-5pm, and Friday 8am-7pm. Call 845-443-8888 for more information. The majority of the calls they get are about testing, but they will help with anything regarding COVID-19 and if they don't have an answer they will do the research and get back to the caller.

Hillary covered some testing basics in her presentation

- Diagnostic Testing Vs. Antibody Testing

Diagnostic Testing is a molecular test done by a nasal swab. These tests can be done by a doctor, laboratory technician, or pharmacy. These test results are reported to the State and local health departments. It is important to note that “Rapid Tests” are not being reported to the State and local health department.

Antibody Testing is a blood test. A positive results indicates a past infection, cannot tell if the person is currently infected. No one is sure currently how long the antibodies will last and if it will protect against future infection.

- COVID Testing Sites

Each site has its own requirements and operations. The Recovery Center can help navigate which site will work best for the caller, providing information such as which sites require an appointment or prescriptions, insurance vs non insurance, if the site is Spanish speaking, and what sites are doing child testing.

- Test Results

The turnaround on test results varies bases on the test site, lab capacity, and demand.

C. “Get Out the Census” Presented by Tara Kleinhans; PR& Development Manager at Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County

The census deadline has been extended to September 30, 2020. The census only takes 10 minutes and guides the federal funding for schools, parks, non-profits, and the states' representation in the government.

- The census is able to be done via phone, online, or mail
